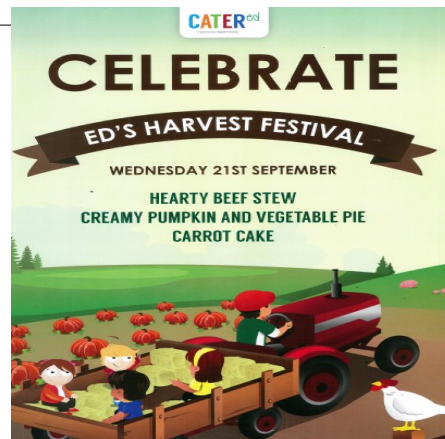

Medication and Consent Forms

All medicines were returned including asthma inhalers on the last day of term. However, there are a few remaining. We are aiming to send a text to those who need to collect them at reception a.s.a.p. Any medication remaining at the end of next week will be returned to a pharmacist for safety.

If your child requires any medication currently please ensure you complete a new consent form when you bring it in via the reception. Previous consent forms prior to 7th Sept 2016 are no longer valid. All medication must have a doctor's prescription label and instructions of use, including asthma inhalers, or it will not be accepted.

Inhaler consent forms will include consent for the use of an emergency inhaler, only for children who are diagnosed with asthma and have an inhaler in school at all times. It will only be given in an emergency, such as their own inhaler becoming unavailable (e.g. faulty), and the parent/carer will be informed of its use by letter.

Please avoid medication being administered at school where possible, for example if dosage required is twice daily then this can be administered at home before and after school. Brown asthma pumps are a good example and some eczema creams. This helps prevent disruption to your child's learning.

It is also essential that antibiotics are administered regularly and the course completed. We frequently find that they are not collected at the end of the day or returned the following day even when the bottle is full. This can make it ineffective and prolong your child's illness.

Please find the time to ensure that the school is aware of ALL your child's medical needs/conditions. Also, if they are no longer diagnosed of a condition. It is important that all our records are current and up to date.
