Parent Update:

Our staff had an interesting time last week, refreshing their Read Write Inc skills and learning more strategies to support children within school. The TA's also practiced their interactive white board skills. Thank you to all staff involved in organizing this and for taking part.

Children in Year 6 have been continuing to share their understanding about why the Mayflower left Plymouth in 1620. This week, they have researched and created a powerpoint sharing all of their knowledge They have also created a diary entry based on sharing what they feel the journey's experience would have been like.

In Kiely class this week we have been started to look at poetry, we explored lots of poems found rhyming words in some of them, we then used the primary colours to mix paints to create the background for our own animal poems which we'll start writing next week.

Carle class have been finding different objects, and practicing their sounds to music.

In Year 5 this week, we have been continuing our art learning by making 3D planets from papier-mâché. We have also begun the process of designing and making our own website page about our planets; looking at the features of webpages and the information we would expect to see on a webpage, so we can include similar when we start putting our webpages together next week.

In Goldsworthy, our theme this week has been comparing transport from the past and the present, looking at similarities and differences between them. In Maths, we have been finding one more and one less than a given number


