Summary of PE Grant

Objectives for 2017-2018

To raise attainment in PE through access to professional coaching/training for staff

To improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision across the Key Stages

To ensure teachers have sufficient training to deliver the curriculum

To enrol and utilise the SSP

To provide opportunities for children to experience a wide range of physical activities.

Impact of spending 2017-2018

- Improvement in the quality of PE teaching through 1:1 CPD. Planning resources provided with these sessions have supported class teachers in delivering these sessions.
- INSETs attended by staff (e.g. tennis) have helped to develop staff confidence and provision within the school.
- Sports leader has attended term partnership meetings which has helped structure our intra and inter school competitions and increased the opportunities for pupils to participate in sport.
- Increased sporting/competitive opportunities have been provided for pupils through the School Sports Partnership support for intra school competition as well as opportunities for children with alternative sporting clubs that have been run.
- Whole school took part in 'Sports Week'
- All KS2 pupils take part in at least 2 hours per week of PE which has helped to improve pupil concentration, commitment and self-esteem leading to better behavior.
- Introduction of a new PE scheme to support the delivery of PE across the whole school with a consistent approach, with new resources.
