We were especially excited to see the Royal Albert Bridge as we have been learning about it and the engineer who built it (I.K Brunel) in our topic lessons this term! The children were so well behaved and had a fantastic afternoon.

This term Matisse class have been learning about bridges. Today they have been on a class trip to walk across the Tamar bridge. Prior to the trip, the children used their inquiry skills to conduct research to find out information about the Tamar bridge and the Royal Albert Bridge. They found out that the Tamar bridge was built in 1961, adjacent to the Royal Albert Bridge which was built by Brunel in 1859. They also found out that the Tamar bridge carries motor vehicles whereas the Royal Albert Bridge is for trains. As part of our trip the children also drew sketches of the bridges.



Mondrian class visited the Tamar bridge today too, as part of our topic "British Bridges". used We our we observational skills as looked at the materials the bridge is made out of and our inquiry skills to ask questions about both the Royal Albert Bridge and the Tamar Bridge. Firstly, we sketched the two bridges from a distance, then we walked on the Tamar Bridge observing the way the bridge was built. Finally, we visited the Visitor's Centre where we looked at "secret" cameras and information about the bridges. It was a fantastic morning! We would like to thank all adults who helped us with the trip including parents.



On Friday 20th May, the whole school celebrated National Drawing Day. Year 6 revisited shading techniques but used a range of media (graded pencils, biro, fineliner and charcoal) to test out different textures. They then used these techniques to complete a black and white drawing. Afterwards, we practised drawing a realistic eye, a portrait and finally one-point perspective.

Free School Meals

If you are in receipt of the following support payments, your child may be entitled to receive free school meals:

- Universal Credit from 1 April 2018 provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods
- Income Support (IS)
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance (IBJSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (IRESA)
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs, that does not exceed £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment someone receives for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

Children who receive a qualifying benefit in their own right are also allowed to receive free school meals.
