Some of the Year 5 children have been lucky enough to visit Barton Hall for their PGL residential trip this week. We hope that they had a wonderful time and look toward to hearing all about their exciting adventures.

In Kiely we have been using our collaboration and observation skills to measure and compare items in centimetres (CM) and metres (M). To link this with our topic, we then compared the heights of different bridges designed by I.K Brunel. The tallest was the Clifton Suspension Bridge which was 75m tall! We have used this information in our English lessons where we have been writing our own information texts, we have been using dictionaries to find the definitions of words we want to include in our glossaries.



Matisse class thoroughly enjoyed taking part in a workshop teaching them how to play Boccia. They learnt that boccia is like bowls and the aim of the game was to try and throw the coloured balls into a hoop. They used their problem solving STEM skill to try and work out the most effective way to get their ball into the hoop.







The foundation children have been learning 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' story this week. The children are getting very good at retelling the story and today they drew their own story maps and then used these to retell the story to their partners. The children have also been observing the class caterpillars daily and have been excited to see how big they have got- they think it won't be long until they start building their cocoons!













In Mondrian class we have

formation texts. As our topic is British Bridges this term, we researched and learnt about

the different types of bridges

and we wrote our own infor-

mation texts.

On Tuesday, it was Mondrian's chance to invite parents/carers to come and read with us. It was a brilliant afternoon that we all enjoyed! Mums, dads, grand parents and babies, all joined us in our Library for some quality reading time. Thank you to all who attended and we are looking forward for the next time.




